There are digitized versions of selected historical print publications dating back to 1978 and digital publications from 2006 to the present. For historical state print publications before 1978 use the Digital Prairie collection *archives.ok.gov*.

Since the collections include older documents that have since been superseded, visitors are urged to always refer to the most recent version of a document for current information.
