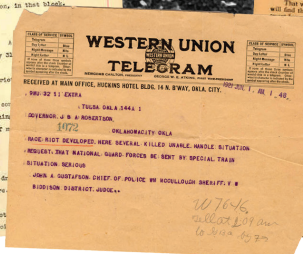
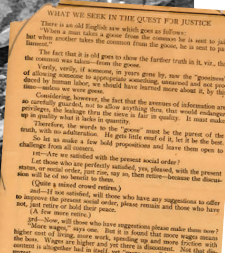
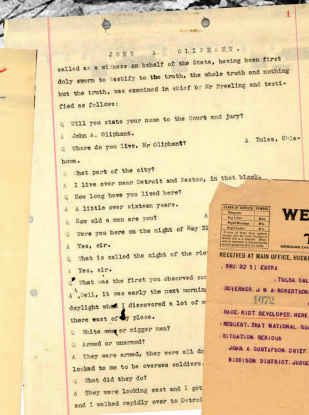
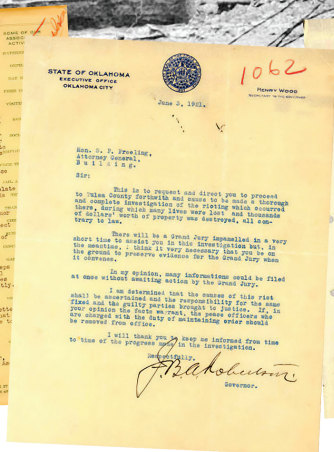
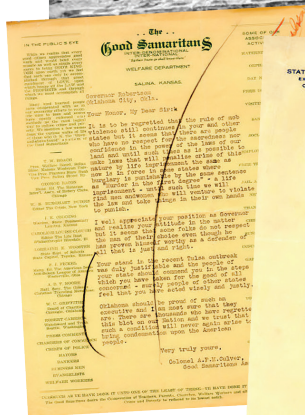


Tulsa Race Massacre
